Today is Thanksgiving Sunday, and we lift up our hearts to Almighty God to thank Him for His great, unceasing mercies to us. Our second hymn this morning is one written by Pastor Martin Rinkart in 1636 in Eilenberg, Germany, in the midst of the Thirty Years War. During this tragic conflict, Eilenberg was besieged and invaded on many occasions. In one year, Pastor Rinkart conducted funerals for 5,000 people, including his wife. His faithful resolve to thank God in every circumstance has inspired God's people for centuries. Today in Germany, Rinkart's "Now Thank We All Our God" is one of the most widely sung hymns, second only to "A Mighty Fortress."
