Today is the first Sunday in the Season of Lent. Lent consists of the forty days (excluding Sundays) before Easter. During these forty days we remember and contemplate the forty day experience of Jesus in the wilderness as He was afflicted and repeatedly tempted by Satan—and overcame him by the Word of God. During these days we humble ourselves before the Lord, seeking His gracious power in our lives, that we may deny ourselves, renounce and resist all evil, and draw near to Him.
