Scotty Smith, a native of Graham, NC, is a graduate of The University of North Carolina, Westminster Theological Seminary, and Covenant Theological Seminary (D. Min). After planting and pastoring Christ Community Church, Franklin, TN, for 26 years, Scotty assumed a position on the pastoral staff of West End Community Church as Teacher in Residence. He also serves as adjunct faculty for Covenant Seminary, Westminster (Philadelphia), RTS Orlando, and Western Seminary in Portland, OR. Scotty has authored ten books, including *Unveiled Hope* (with Michael Card), *Objects of His Affection*, *Restoring Broken Things* (with Steven Curtis Chapman), and most recently, *Every Season Prayers: Gospel-Centered Prayers for the Whole of Life*. Scotty and his wife of 46 years, Darlene, live in Franklin, TN.
