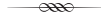

Thus, the peace calls us to move toward our brothers and sisters as Christ moves toward us in reconciling grace and mutual love.

THE MORNING PRAYERS

READING FROM THE PENTATEUCH

Numbers 10:11-36

In the second year, in the second month, on the twentieth day of the month, the cloud lifted from over the tabernacle of the testimony,¹² and the people of Israel set out by stages from the wilderness of Sinai. And the cloud settled down in the wilderness of Paran.¹³ They set out for the first time at the command of Yahweh by Moses.¹⁴ The standard of the camp of the people of Judah set out first by their companies, and over their company was Nahshon the son of Amminadab.¹⁵ And over the company of the tribe of the people of Issachar was Nethanel the son of Zuar.¹⁶ And over the company of the tribe of the people of Zebulun was Eliab the son of Helon.

¹⁷And when the tabernacle was taken down, the sons of Gershon and the sons of Merari, who carried the tabernacle, set out.¹⁸ And the standard of the camp of Reuben set out by their companies, and over their company was Elizur the son of Shedeur.¹⁹ And over the company of the tribe of the people of Simeon was Shelumiel the son of Zurishaddai.²⁰ And over the company of the tribe of the people of Gad was Eliasaph the son of Deuel.

²¹Then the Kohathites set out, carrying the holy things, and the tabernacle was set up before their arrival.²² And the standard of the camp of the people of Ephraim set out by their companies, and over their company was Elishama the son of Ammihud.²³ And over the company of the tribe of the people of Manasseh was Gamaliel the son of Pedahzur.²⁴ And over the company of the tribe of the people of Benjamin was Abidan the son of Gideoni.

²⁵Then the standard of the camp of the people of Dan, acting as the rear guard of all the camps, set out by their companies, and over their company was Ahiezer the son of Ammishaddai.²⁶ And over the company of the tribe of the people of Asher was Pagiel the son of Ocran.²⁷ And over the company of the tribe of the people of Naphtali was Ahira the son of Enan.²⁸ This was the order of march of the people of Israel by their companies, when they set out.

²⁹And Moses said to Hobab the son of Reuel the Midianite, Moses' father-in-law, "We are setting out for the place of which Yahweh said,

'I will give it to you.' Come with us, and we will do good to you, for Yahweh has promised good to Israel." ³⁰But he said to him, "I will not go. I will depart to my own land and to my kindred." ³¹And he said, "Please do not leave us, for you know where we should camp in the wilderness, and you will serve as eyes for us. ³²And if you do go with us, whatever good Yahweh will do to us, the same will we do to you."

³³So they set out from the mount of Yahweh three days' journey. And the ark of the covenant of Yahweh went before them three days' journey, to seek out a resting place for them. ³⁴And the cloud of Yahweh was over them by day, whenever they set out from the camp.

³⁵And whenever the ark set out, Moses said, "Arise, O Yahweh, and let your enemies be scattered, and let those who hate you flee before you."

³⁶And when it rested, he said, "Return, O Yahweh, to the ten thousand thousands of Israel."
