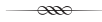

READING FROM THE NEW TESTAMENT

Revelation 5:1-10

Then I saw in the right hand of him who was seated on the throne a scroll written within and on the back, sealed with seven seals. ²And I saw a mighty angel proclaiming with a loud voice, "Who is worthy to open the scroll and break its seals?" ³And no one in heaven or on earth or under the earth was able to open the scroll or to look into it, ⁴and I began to weep loudly because no one was found worthy to open the scroll or to look into it. ⁵And one of the elders said to me, "Weep no more; behold, the Lion of the tribe of Judah, the Root of David, has conquered, so that he can open the scroll and its seven seals."

READING FROM THE PENTATEUCH

Genesis 49-50:3

Then Jacob called his sons and said, "Gather yourselves together, that I may tell you what shall happen to you in days to come.

²"Assemble and listen, O sons of Jacob,
listen to Israel your father.

³"Reuben, you are my firstborn,
my might, and the firstfruits of my strength,
preeminent in dignity and preeminent in power.

There they buried Isaac and Rebekah his wife, and there I buried Leah—³²the field and the cave that is in it were bought from the Hittites.” ³³When Jacob finished commanding his sons, he drew up his feet into the bed and breathed his last and was gathered to his people.

Confession of Faith: Our Confident Access
