Malachi 2:10-16

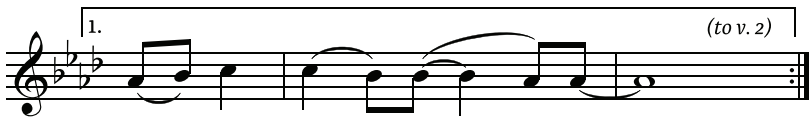

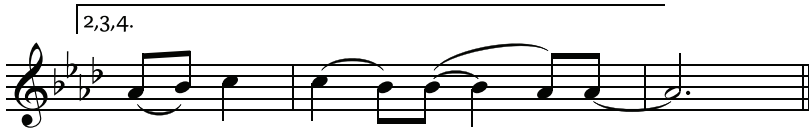
