*for Thine is the kingdom, and the power, and the glory, forever, Amen.*

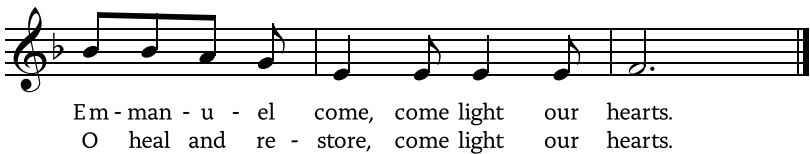
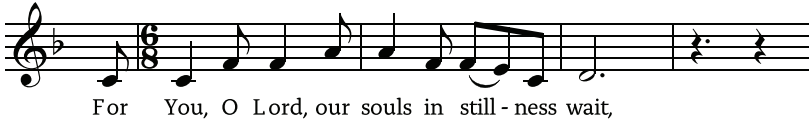
## **Invitation to the Table**
