"O Father, You are Sovereign"





READING FROM THE EPISTLES

Colossians 3:1-17

If then you have been raised with Christ, seek the things that are above, where Christ is, seated at the right hand of God. ²Set your minds on things that are above, not on things that are on earth. ³For you have died, and your life is hidden with Christ in God. ⁴When Christ who is your life appears, then you also will appear with him in glory.

And be thankful. ¹⁶Let the word of Christ dwell in you richly, teaching and admonishing one another in all wisdom, singing psalms and hymns and spiritual songs, with thankfulness in your hearts to God. ¹⁷And whatever you do, in word or deed, do everything in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks to God the Father through him.

One in ten children will experience sexual abuse before their 18th birthday. As a member of our community, it is highly likely that someone you know or care for has experienced, or is currently experiencing, child sexual abuse. For this reason, this training is required for all those who work with children or youth; others are encouraged to come but space is limited. Please register at covpres.com.

COVID Policy. Effective today, social distancing and masks are required for all persons when indoors on Covenant's campus (masks are recommended for children aged 3 – kindergarten and required for all children in 1st grade or older). We will continue to worship together on Sunday mornings, without communion, through September 12.
