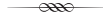

Jeremiah 10:1-11, 16

Words of Institution

Matthew 26:26-29; 1 Corinthians 11:23-26

Prayer of Humble Access

We come to your Table, Lord Jesus, not trusting in our own righteousness, but in your rich mercies. We are not worthy, O Great King, to gather up the crumbs under your Table, yet you are the King of mercy. Grant us therefore, gracious Lord, in this breaking of bread, a rich participation in your body, and in this cup, a stronger grasp of your grace, that by your Spirit, we may commune with you and you with us. Amen.

Prayer of Consecration and the Lord's Prayer

Gracious God, pour out your Holy Spirit upon us and upon these your gifts of bread and wine, that the bread we break and the cup we bless may be the communion of the body and blood of Christ. By your Spirit make us one with Christ, that we may be one with all who share this feast and united in ministry with your people in every place.

This we pray in the name of the One who taught us to pray, saying:

Our Father, who art in heaven, Hallowed be Thy Name.

Thy kingdom come, Thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven.

Give us this day our daily bread,

and forgive us our debts as we forgive our debtors.
