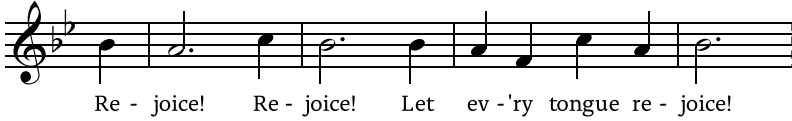

Leviticus 19:1-4, 9-18, 32-37

Yahweh spoke to Moses: ²“Speak to the whole congregation of the Israelites and tell them, ‘You must be holy because I, Yahweh your God, am holy. ³Each of you must respect his mother and his father, and you must keep my Sabbaths. I am Yahweh your God. ⁴Do not turn to idols, and you must not make for yourselves gods of cast metal. I am Yahweh your God.

You must fear your God; I am Yahweh.

¹⁵“You must not deal unjustly in judgment: You must neither show partiality to the poor nor honor the rich. You must judge your fellow citizen fairly. ¹⁶You must not go about as a slanderer among your people. You must not stand idly by when your neighbor’s life is at stake. I am Yahweh. ¹⁷You must not hate your brother in your heart. You must surely reprove your fellow citizen so that you do not incur sin on account of him. ¹⁸You must not take vengeance or bear a grudge against any of your people, but you must love your neighbor as yourself. I am Yahweh.

³²“You must stand up in the presence of the aged, honor the presence of an elder, and fear your God. I am Yahweh. ³³When a resident foreigner lives with you in your land, you must not oppress him. ³⁴The resident foreigner who lives with you must be to you as a native citizen among you; so you must love the foreigner as yourself, because you were foreigners in the land of Egypt. I am Yahweh your God. ³⁵You must not do injustice in the regulation of measures, whether of length, weight, or volume. ³⁶You must have honest balances, honest weights, an honest ephah, and an honest hin. I am Yahweh your God who brought you out from the land of Egypt. ³⁷You must be sure to obey all my statutes and regulations. I am Yahweh.”

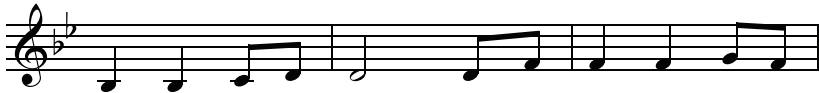

It precedes our coming to the Lord's Table because this sacrament manifests and celebrates our unity in Christ as one body. 1 Corinthians 11:18-19 implores us not to let factions and divisions remain in our midst. Thus, the peace calls us to move toward our brothers and sisters as Christ moves toward us in reconciling grace and mutual love.

1 Peter 1:13-21

Therefore, preparing your minds for action, and being sober-minded, set your hope fully on the grace that will be brought to you at the revelation of Jesus Christ. ¹⁴As obedient children, do not be conformed to the passions of your former ignorance, ¹⁵but as he who called you is holy, you also be holy in all your conduct, ¹⁶since it is written, "You shall be holy, for I am holy."

¹⁷And if you call upon the Father who judges impartially according to each one's deeds, conduct yourselves with fear throughout the time of your exile, ¹⁸knowing that you were ransomed from the futile ways inherited from your forefathers, not with perishable things such as silver or gold, ¹⁹but with the precious blood of Christ, like that of a lamb without blemish or spot. ²⁰He was foreknown before the foundation of the world but was made manifest in the last times for your sake. ²¹Through him you trust in God, who raised him from among the dead and gave him glory, so that your faith and hope are in God.

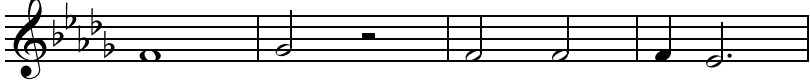

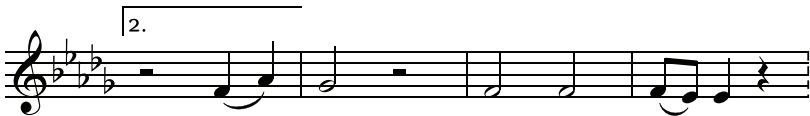
