## READING FROM THE GOSPELS

Luke 8:41-56

And there came a man named Jairus, who was a ruler of the synagogue. And falling at Jesus' feet, he implored him to come to his house, <sup>42</sup>for he had an only daughter, about twelve years of age, and she was dying.

As Jesus went, the people pressed around him. <sup>43</sup>And there was a woman who had had a discharge of blood for twelve years, and though she had spent all her living on physicians, she could not be healed by anyone. <sup>44</sup>She came up behind him and touched the fringe of his garment, and immediately her discharge of blood ceased. <sup>45</sup>And Jesus said, "Who was it that touched me?" When all denied it, Peter said, "Master, the crowds surround you and are pressing in on you!" <sup>46</sup>But Jesus said, "Someone touched me, for I perceive that power has gone out from me." <sup>47</sup>And when the woman saw that she was not hidden, she came trembling, and falling down before him declared in the presence of all the people why she had touched him, and how she had been immediately healed. <sup>48</sup>And he said to her, "Daughter, your faith has made you well; go in peace."

## READING FROM THE PENTATEUCH

Numbers 5:1-10

Yahweh spoke to Moses, saying, <sup>2</sup>“Command the people of Israel that they put out of the camp everyone who is leprous or has a discharge and everyone who is unclean through contact with the dead. <sup>3</sup>You shall put out both male and female, putting them outside the camp, that they may not defile their camp, in the midst of which I dwell.” <sup>4</sup>And the people of Israel did so, and put them outside the camp; as Yahweh said to Moses, so the people of Israel did.

<sup>5</sup>And Yahweh spoke to Moses, saying, <sup>6</sup>“Speak to the people of Israel, When a man or woman commits any of the sins that people commit by breaking faith with Yahweh, and that person realizes his guilt, <sup>7</sup>he shall confess his sin that he has committed. And he shall make full restitution for his wrong, adding a fifth to it and giving it to him to whom he did the wrong. <sup>8</sup>But if the man has no next of kin to whom restitution may be made for the wrong, the restitution for wrong shall go to Yahweh for the priest, in addition to the ram of atonement with which atonement is made for him. <sup>9</sup>And every contribution, all the holy donations of the people of Israel, which they bring to the priest, shall be his. <sup>10</sup>Each one shall keep his holy donations: whatever anyone gives to the priest shall be his.”

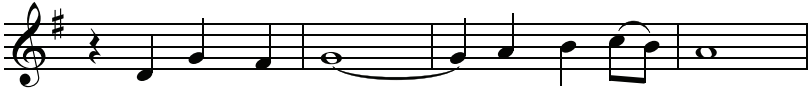

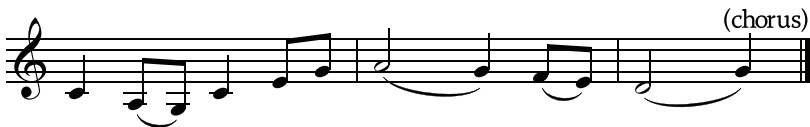
