

Leviticus 26:3-4, 14-16, 40-46

“If you walk in my statutes and observe my commandments and do them, <sup>4</sup>then I will give you your rains in their season, and the land shall yield its increase, and the trees of the field shall yield their fruit.

<sup>14</sup>“But if you will not listen to me and will not do all these commandments, <sup>15</sup>if you reject my statutes, and if your soul hates my rules, so that you will not do all my commandments, but break my covenant, <sup>16</sup>then I will do this to you: I will visit you with panic, with wasting disease and fever that consume the eyes and make the heart ache. And you shall sow your seed in vain, for your enemies shall eat it.

<sup>40</sup>“But if they confess their iniquity and the iniquity of their fathers in their treachery that they committed against me, and also in walking contrary to me, <sup>41</sup>so that I walked contrary to them and brought them into the land of their enemies—if then their uncircumcised heart is humbled and they make amends for their iniquity, <sup>42</sup>then I will remember my covenant with Jacob, and I will remember my covenant with Isaac and my covenant with Abraham, and I will remember the land. <sup>43</sup>But the land shall be abandoned by them and enjoy its Sabbaths while it lies desolate without them, and they shall make amends for their iniquity, because they rejected my rules and their soul hated my statutes. <sup>44</sup>Yet for all that, when they are in the land of their enemies, I will not reject them, neither will I hate them so as to destroy them utterly and break my covenant with them, for I am Yahweh their God. <sup>45</sup>But for their sake I will remember the covenant with their forefathers, whom I brought out of the land of Egypt in the sight of the nations, that I might be their God: I am Yahweh.”

<sup>46</sup>These are the statutes and rules and laws that Yahweh made between himself and the people of Israel through Moses on Mount Sinai.
