January 6 is Epiphany Day. The word “epiphany” comes from the Greek work “epiphaneo,” which means “to manifest/to reveal.” We celebrate today the epiphany of Jesus Christ to the Gentiles in the coming of the Gentile Magi from the East, to whom God revealed the glory of His Son. The Eastern Church celebrates the Incarnation of Christ today, much as we do in the West during the twelve days of Christmastide (December 25–January 5).

Matthew 2:1-12

Now after Jesus was born in Bethlehem of Judea in the days of Herod the king, behold, wise men from the east came to Jerusalem, ²saying, "Where is he who has been born king of the Jews?
