M READING FROM THE GOSPELS

John 1:19-34

And this is the testimony of John, when the Jews sent priests and Levites from Jerusalem to ask him, "Who are you?" ²⁰He confessed, and did not deny, but confessed, "I am not the Christ." ²¹And they asked him, "What then? ³⁴And I have seen and have borne witness that this is the Son of God."
